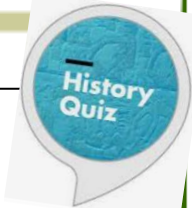




Perrymount History Newsletter

History

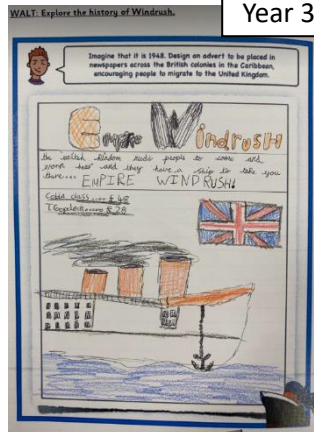

Apart from our set topics, we also like to focus upon British events such as the coronation of the King. This promotes in our children a sense of belonging to the wider world, which exists outside our school walls.

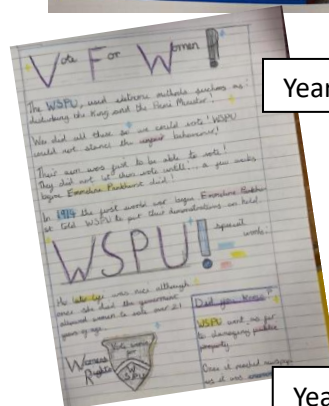

History is an amazing subject. We hope that by giving our children an understanding of not only what we have achieved but also the mistakes of the past they will go onto create a better future.

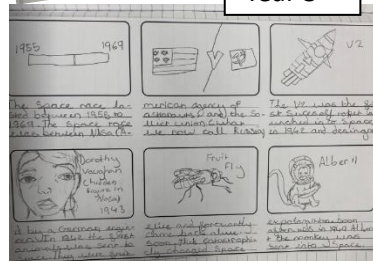
